<u>Biosecurity</u> <u>Protocols</u>

As with any farm, we ask you not to come on the premises if your horse is sick, not acting themselves, or has been exposed to an illness or contagious virus. Please ensure your horse's vaccinations are up-to-date for the current year of showing. It is recommended to have vaccinations in the horse's system for at least three weeks before going to any show or off-site venue.

For the safety of our horses here at the farm, we ask you to refrain from touching or petting any of the horses in the fields. They do love to be admired, however, so a nice wave and hello from a distance would probably be appreciated! Also, please refrain from touching the wooden fences.

There are various water hydrants on the property for your use. Please make sure to bring your own buckets to use to water and wash your horses.

Since Covid is still circulating, if you or any member of your immediate household has Covid, or has been exposed to Covid, please do not attend the shows.

At no time may any visitor, rider, or spectator enter the barn on the property. Please ask for assistance if you require any help.

<u>Ribbons</u>

Ribbons are awarded for 1st through 10th place in the New Beginnings Equine Stables Hunter and Jumper Shows.

Ribbons are awarded for 1st through 6th place for the KHJA Hunter Show.

Points are accumulated throughout the three New Beginnings Equine Stables hunter shows and will go towards division overall points for the end of the season awards. Riders must attend two of the three hunter shows in order to qualify for year-end awards.

Show Points will be awarded not only for placings (1st, 2nd, 3rd, etc.) but will also have a multiplying factor, depending on the number of entrants in that division at that show. For KHJA shows, points will be awarded solely for 1st through 6th place.

General Rules

- 1. Horses may have multiple riders and be entered into multiple divisions as long as it is only one horse / rider combination in each separate division.
- 2. Open divisions are open to all horses and riders (no crossing over in hack classes).
- 3. All riders under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- 4. All riders must wear a properly fastened helmet when mounted on the show grounds.
- 5. All hunter riders must wear proper show attire, including a show jacket (jacket may be excused at Judge's discretion).
- 6. Jumpers may wear a properly fitted shirt with no belly exposed.
- 7. Manes are to be braided or neatly pulled. Tail braids are optional.
- 8. Standing martingales are permitted in over fences classes only. Running martingales are not permitted in the hunter ring. Bits should follow EC Hunter rules. One exclusion: Bitless bridles will be permitted.
- 9. Micklem bridles may be used without the use of bit clamps.
- 10. Paid schooling rounds will consist of one pre-set out course. Upon two refusals at one jump, rider will be excused.
- 11. If a rider dismounts before the end of their last fence, rider will be excused.
- 12. Rider will be excused from the ring after two refusals at the same fence.
- 13. Lame or unruly horses will be excused from the ring at the discretion of the judge.
- 14. Stallions must be declared ahead of time and may only be ridden in the jumper ring by a rider 18 years of age or older. A blue ribbon must be attached to the stallion's tail.
- 15. Horses are to enter and exit the ring at a walk.
- 16. All dogs on property must be leashed and supervised by owner.
- 17. Judge's decision is final.
- 18. No refunds will be made. All fees must be paid prior to participating in the class.

Hunter Rules and Information

- Flashes, figure 8, and dropped nosebands are not permitted in any hunter division
- Boots and bandages are not permitted in any hunter division
- Standing martingales and breastplates are permitted for over fences classes only
- Micklem bridles without bit clips are permitted
- Crops are not permitted in flat classes

Hunter Under Saddle

To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways in the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is permissible.

Hunter Over Fences

Working hunters are judged on their jumping style, manners, and way of going. Horses are judged from the time they enter the ring until the time they leave the ring.

Road Hack:

A road hack is a calm, yet forward horse that is capable of traveling long distances with minimal effort. He should have a pleasant attitude, yet look as though he has the energy to keep a brisk pace for an extended time. The judge will be looking for a horse who is not spooky or silly and who looks comfortable to ride. Not only will the basic walk, trot and canter be judged, but you might be asked for a working trot or a hand gallop. A working trot is a strong, forward trot that covers a lot of ground without being rushed. The hand gallop is executed in a two-point or half-seat where the horse is asked to gallop forward in a controlled manner so that it covers the maximum ground with minimal effort.

Show Hack:

Unlike the road and pleasure hacks, the show hack asks for the horse to be collected and working well in hand. A show hack may be asked to perform a range of gaits including collected, working and extended trots and hand gallops. At all times the show hack should be paying close attention to its rider with prompt transitions and an alert expression. The rider should be attentive to his horse with good equitation and control. The horse should be an excellent mover who will stand out in a crowd. Working well on the bit a show hack should carry itself from the quarters and show impulsion.

Pleasure Hack:

Perhaps the best understood of the hack classes, the pleasure hack judges how quiet and calm a horse is. The theory is that a pleasure horse should be a pleasure to ride. It should be safe and comfortable with easy transitions and a pleasant expression. To judge these qualities the judge will ask for a basic walk, trot and canter. In each gait the judge is looking for a long, low stride with a relaxed carriage and the appearance of a smooth ride. The horse should be forward, but should not appear rushed or stressed in any way. A rider who is relaxed and who uses minimal aids can show off the pleasure horse in the best light.



Hunter Hack:

A hunter hack is forward and works well on the bit. They should have three clean gaits with good transitions. While having good movement is still important the movement should be such that the horse would be suited to riding through the fields when out on a hunt rather than just in the ring. Comfort is important, but a forward way of going is essential to a good hunter hack. A hand gallop may be requested in this class.

Helpful Tips:

Practice collect, normal, and extended trot and canter. Practice smooth transitions up and down. Hand gallop in two-point or half-seat. You may even be asked to back up. A correct English reverse for changing direction is required.

Lead Line



Lead Line Division will consist of three classes. First class will be a walk class. The horse will walk around the ring being led by a capable handler. Judges will look for hands, body, and leg position and turnout (they are all cute!) The second class is a trot class. The horses will be asked to trot a few metres between two pylons while being led by the handler. The third class will be an in-hand class where the rider will lead and walk their horse from one pylon to another pylon, turn, and walk back to where they started. A handler may accompany the rider.

There will be a champion and reserve champion for this division. All riders will receive a ribbon for each class in which they participate.

Jumper Division

Information

Table A With Jump-Off:

When you enter the ring, you'll hear a buzzer, after which you have 45 seconds to cross the start line to begin your round (If you don't begin in time, the timer for your round begins anyway, so you'll have to be that much faster to not incur time faults).

Competitors jump their course within the time allowed, and hopefully go clear by not taking down any rails. If you're clear, stay in the ring after your round, and wait for the buzzer. After the buzzer, begin your jump-off course, which will be a shorter and amended version of your first course. For the jump-off, aim to go fast and make handy turns. You want to go clear, most importantly, but you also want a faster time than everyone else as well. Don't get too crazy, though. Nobody likes a scary round.

Note: For the Cross-Rails division, the jump-off will not be immediate. Riders who go clear in their round will be invited back to do their jump-off.

Table A Speed:

This class is run similarly to the regular Table A With Jump-Off class, but there is no jump-off. Instead, the time from the first round will act as the tie-breaker between those with the fewest faults. The strategy in this class is therefore to go as quickly as you can without knocking any rails down from the start.

Table C Speed Round:

These classes are speed rounds. There is no jump-off, so you need to aim to go clear and fast. Rounds are scored by faults and time taken. Each rail down adds four seconds to your total score. Be careful, though. Crazy, dangerous riding may be cause for the judge to whistle you out of that class. Rider and horse safety is paramount at schooling level shows.

<u>\$300.00 Mini-Prix</u>

0.7m and 0.8m Combined

The mini prix will have a higher entry fee than the other classes of the division in order to allow for greater prize money (\$30.00 entry fee). The course may also be longer than your usual jumper course. In addition to the potential increased length, the level of difficulty will generally be a bit higher, with a double or triple combination in most cases and sometimes spookier jumps as well as more technical questions.

The jump-off after a clear round will be immediate.

1st Place: \$100.00 plus min-prix ribbon 2nd Place: \$80.00 plus mini-prix ribbon 3rd Place: \$60.00 plus mini-prix ribbon 4th Place: \$40.00 plus mini-prix ribbon 5th Place: \$20.00 plus mini-prix ribbon 6th Place: mini-prix ribbon 7th Place: mini-prix ribbon 8th Place: mini-prix ribbon

Schooling Rounds



Schooling rounds will be available just prior to the start of the over fences classes in the current division. Cost is \$5.00 per round for hunter schooling and \$10.00 per round for jumper schooling. There will be one prescribed course available for schooling purposes. Should a horse refuse twice at one jump during that schooling round, the judge will blow the whistle and the rider is asked to leave the ring.

We need to keep in mind the length of the day and the amount of daylight hours available at the shows. Hence, this is how schooling rounds will take place.

At this point, we can only guarantee schooling rounds will be available for the first show in the series. Should time go well at the first show, we may certainly continue schooling rounds for the remainder of the shows. Should we find the show runs late after the first show, we may need to limit or eliminate school rounds. We will keep you posted as we go through the year.

Parking Information

Parking is available in the fields near the road. We may also pre-arrange with a barn who has several horses showing to park nearer the jumper ring in the long field. Two to three trailers can be accompanied in this area per show.


The east side (right hand side) of the driveway is for trailers. Trailers are asked to park facing the driveway to facilitate easier leaving. Larger trailers are asked to park back nearer to the tree line, if possible and driver is comfortable doing so. Two horse and three horse trailers are to park closer to the driveway, if possible. There are marked entry points and exit points. There are to be no vehicles parked in the entry and exit marked areas. We strive to 'cut grass roads' so you will be able to see the 'road' parking area and the uncut grass parking area. By leaving the 'cut grass area' open, this will allow for trailers to come and go much easier.

Cars are to park on the west side (left hand side) of the driveway. Cars are to enter through the pylons and park on either side, facing out, if possible. No parking is to take place within the pylon area. In the case of extra trailer parking space, two horse trailers MIGHT be able to enter this parking area. Please note the entrance is only 30 feet wide, and a turn is needed in order to enter this field.

We ask that cars park on the left hand side because the entrance to this field is only 30 feet wide. Most trailers will not be able to confidently enter this field. We need to maximize the trailer parking on the other side, hence it is only for trailers. We do apologize for any inconvenience.

Please note that spectators who have difficulty walking, for any reason, are welcome to have drivers take them up to the **barn area and drop them off**, then the cars can return to park in the front field. In the case that sun shelters, lawn chairs, and coolers need to be brought, cars are also welcome to bring those things up to the barn, have someone unload, and then the car return to the parking area.

Accessible parking is available up at the barn for all people who require it.



About Us

We are a family owned and run equestrian boarding facility situated on 60 acres. We have been in this location for 11 years, and started from scratch. You will find these people in various places during the shows. Everyone will be wearing a New Beginnings Equine Stables grey shirt. People are located in the parking area, the registration area, the judge's area, the gate and ring area, and will be walking around the property. Please do not hesitate to ask any of these incredible people a question, if needed.
